One young forester who came to consider Pat a second father figure went out on a survey with Pat and they agreed on a meeting place. Being much younger he was so confident that he would beat Pat there, only to be surprised when Pat was sitting there waiting on him and asked, "What took you so long?"

He enjoyed Westerns such as Lonesome Dove and Gun Smoke. He was an avid reader. He enjoyed working with his hands. He painted pictures of ships and ocean scenes, cabins, trucks, and many other things. He is reputed to be quite the handyman and wood worker. He loved motorcycles. Pat and Theresa took a motorcycle ride from Appalachian to Nova Scotia and back. He loved nature and animals. He took walks in the woods with his dog, Willie. Sometimes it was hard to tell if Willie was Pats pet or Pat was his pet. He also collected rocks on his walks and built a rock wall with them.

He loved his family and they loved him. He loved Theresa and she loved him. You needed to listen to what he was saying because he has a sneaky sense of humor. 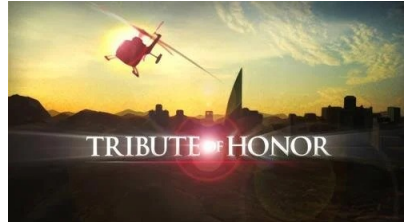
