Randall "Tex" Lawler, age 97, passed away Monday, September 28, 2020 at The Laurels in Norton, Virginia. He was born March 8, 1923 in Houston, Texas and had lived in Dickenson County since the early 60's. Mr. Lawler was a veteran of the United States Marine Corp, having served in World War II and the Korean Conflict, where he was awarded The Bronze Star. He was the first mayor of Clinchco, Virginia having served from 1990 to 2004. He was preceded in death by his wife, Edith Lawler; his parents, Fred Eldridge and Willie Mae Garrette Lawler; his son, David Lawler; and his dear pet, Blackie.

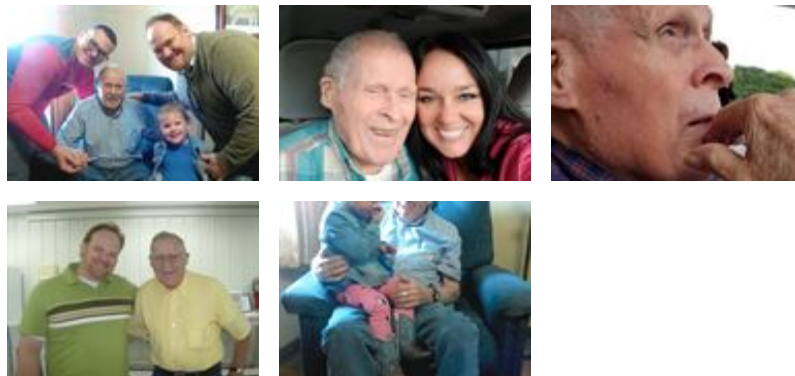

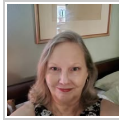
