Praying for Loretta his wife as i know how hard it is losing your husband. I'm also praying for Blake, Farrahbelle, Gracie, and Loretta's 4 nephews that he raised. But I will also keep Robert in my prayers as his first born child. I noticed you left his name off the obituary.

Leaving Robert out of the obituary doesn't magically make him not Steven's son. It just confirms that you were willing to erase a man's child to soothe your own insecurity — and that's a level of smallness most people grow out of by adulthood.

What's truly revolting is that this wasn't done in a moment of shock or confusion. You sat with it. You typed it. You read it back. And at no point did basic human decency stop you.

If you thought this made you look important, powerful, or central to Steven's life, it did the opposite. All it did was announce to everyone reading that you are so threatened by the existence of his son that you tried to pretend he never mattered and never existed.

A normal person understands that a child is not competition. A normal person understands that a son cannot be edited out like an inconvenient footnote. The fact that you don't is honestly disturbing.

You didn't protect anything. You didn't "win" anything. You simply showed how comfortable you are being cruel to someone who posed no threat to you whatsoever — and how little shame you're capable of feeling while doing it.

*You didn't erase Robert.
You exposed yourself.
And that stain is yours to keep.*
